In February we will be bringing back No Secrets, a personal safety presentation, by the Central Alberta Sexual Assault Support Centre. This program is for children in grades K-4 with a focus on teaching children personal safety as a supportive skill and tool in the prevention of child sexual abuse. The presentations will include:

- Public vs. Private how do we treat public and private things with kindness?
- · Parts of the body (including the proper names for our private parts)
- My Body Is My Own, bodies are private you can decide if you want to give a hug or a high five
- Safe & Unsafe Touching what is safe & unsafe touching?
- Safe & Unsafe Secrets what are safe & unsafe secrets?
- Personal Safety Rules Say 'No', Go, Tell a trusted adult
- Body Boundary Rules no one should look at, touch, or take pictures of our bodies without our permission.
- Safety Network who can you tell if something unsafe? like unsafe touching or secrets, happens

This presentation does not refer to child sexual abuse or sexual violence and is NOT sexual health education.



A message from Superintendent Kurt Sacher

Acting in support of our commitment to our 900 Indigenous students and their families, and to embrace Indigenous Learning for all students and staff, we will be installing Treaty flags inside schools across our division as a sign of respect to Indigenous Peoples.

Recently, our Board of Trustees, Leadership Team, and School Administration Teams shared an important flag ceremony with Elders, Knowledge Keepers and special guests from Treaty 6, Treaty 7 and the Métis Nation.

It was a touching and historic moment for our school division. It fills us with tremendous pride as we continue to make authentic steps forward with respect to truth and reconciliation. It was a special day in our critically important journey.

I would like to thank our Indigenous Learning team for bringing us together with our honoured guests, and to all our administrators, staff and trustees for what they have all done to this point and for what they will continue to do.

The admin team from your child's school will provide further information on their own flag ceremony as their plans evolve, and we thank you for walking alongside us throughout this journey. In Chinook's Edge, our actions will always speak louder than our words.
