4.0 Reports/Updates (15 minutes)

- a) School Report Kory Sholdice
 - i) JDES Rebrand- Held a meeting on February 28- received feedback from staff, parents and students. Mission statement- want to tie in "community" theme. Narrowed it down to 2 Mission's/ 2 Motto's/ 2 Mascots: Bear or Wolf. Mottos are simple. JDES students will be able to vote on their favourite (Bear vs. Wolf) with the help of the Gr. 9 Leadership students. Graphic designer has been hired to create potential logos once animal/ motto is decided. Final step

- will be for students, staff and parents to vote on the final logo/ mascot. Reveal in June 2024.
- ii) FNMI Artist/ Outdoor Classroom Art Update- McKenzie Brown- Cree Artist; from Treaty 8. Plan to create 'Art Kits' with lessons to connect the school/ students to the artwork. Artwork will be brought in during the winter to preserve/ enjoy it indoors. The unveiling will be on Orange Shirt Day (Fall 2024).
- iii) Loose Parts Shed- Imaginative Play- JDES is hoping to move forward with the Shed in the spring (2024) once snow melts. Approximate cost \$2000-\$2500. Request for the Parent Society to fund this project. Questions/ concerns brought up about Shed. Other options for "Imaginative Play" (Hopscotch/ sidewalk games / more swings) rather than the shed. Tammy Burton to give presentation on 'Loose Parts Shed' (hopefully at our next meeting).
- iv) Schlocky-Planning for 2 Schlocky pads to be built. School approached Jeff Borle with Jencor Contracting to build them. Approximate cost \$2000-\$3000 (for both). Hoping to build them this summer. Request for the Parent Society to fund this project.
- v) Spell-a-thon -March 22, 2024 -kickoff/ student assembly. April 10-testing. April 26- celebration/ assembly. There will be group and individual prizes. The school has been in touch with sponsors and feel they have an adequate amount of prizes; will reach out if that changes.
- vi) Crosswalk Safety/ Signage Follow Up- Town Councillor Cameron Galiski was absent. Brandi is corresponding with him via email about Crosswalk Safety/ Signage concerns. Will discuss further in Parent Society Board Meeting.
- b) Teacher Report Given by Kory Sholdice (5-10 minutes)
 - Kindergarten- Practicing letters & numbers to 10. Having fun with centers.
 - Grade 1- Working on their short writing & journaling. Animal Projects- Paper Mache & Pop Up Books; each class is doing a different animal. Polar Bear, Canada Goose, Arctic Fox and Rabbit. Parents coming in to help with Paper Mache projects.
 - Grade 2- Math- Addition with regrouping. Science- Space/ Earth Systems. Language Arts- Fairytales. Social Studies- Spring time in Saskatoon.
 - Grade 3- Earth Science, Multiplication, Studying the Ukraine, Poetry, Reading Fantastic Mr. Fox. Studying healthy habits; benefits laughter & exercise. Some classes are starting to work on coding.

- c) School Board Trustee's Report Sherry Cooper (10 minutes)
 - Rural Education Symposium held in March; celebrating Rural Schools.
 Discussed the benefits of rural education; more personable, more innovative (partly due to smaller budgets), bonus of a smaller school "can't hide" mentality, more community connections. 5 students presented answers to questions that senior leadership had also answered and it was encouraging that everyone's responses were very similar.
 - At the last CESD School Board Meeting:
 - Budget is due for approval at the end of May; schools are preparing for it.
 - Discussion took place of wanting to inform more people about the great things happening in CESD. Example- Letting people know about the Outdoor Classroom at JDES. Wanting to put things like that on the Rural Caucus Weblink; Superintendent is working on it.
 - Numbers are up; 11,380 + enrollment for the division.
 - Currently doing Policy Review/ Rewriting; CESD Renumeration, Trustee Code of Conduct and AI Code of Conduct (being considered).
 - Penhold Waskasoo Middle School Playground
 - Fundraising efforts underway
 - CFEP (Community Facility Enhancement Program) Grant; will match up to \$125,000 of secured funds raised. Need community support to reach this goal. Deadline to raise funds for this Grant is June 2024.
 - NSBA (National School Board Association) Conference 2024; to be held in New Orleans. Attended by School Boards from across the USA & North America. A couple of Trustees from CESD will be attending.
 - ASCA (Alberta School Councils' Association) AGM 2024- Held in Edmonton. Interested persons were to submit their names to the school principal. CESD will be sending 10 people total; 2 were selected from Penhold Crossing Secondary School. A governance committee will be formed to establish who will be selected in the future.
