Kinder

Is finishing up colors, starting letters and exploring FALL!!

Grade One:

In language arts we are working on CVC words which includes spelling and applying our spelling to our journals using sentences of the day. We are beginning decomposing and composing numbers to 5 as in introduction to addition and subtraction units. The grade 1s went on a leaf walk this past week and used the leaves as part of our Earth Systems unit examining seasonal changes.

Grade Two:

Math - We have finished up reviewing numbers to 20 and are working on repeating patterns

LA - We are working on diagraphs (sh, ch, th) and blends (sl, st, dr, bl, fr, cr,tr) and starting long vowels in phonic. We are writing good sentences with capitals and punctuation. Reading is focusing on stamina - being able to read longer and fluency

Science - Testing materials

Social Studies -what makes up a community and identifying provinces and territories in Canada.
