5) Reports/Updates (15 minutes)

a) School Report - Principal Kory Sholdice

#### January Events and Activities

- Skating Kristine Horrocks applied for a grant from Hockey Alberta and we received \$5000. The money has allowed us to:
  - Take grades 1-3 will go to the Multiplex for skating 3 times with bussing.

- Purchased skates and helmets to be lent to students who do not have access to equipment.
- Farm Safety Ray Hoppins (former associate superintendent) will be here on January 24th and 27th to present the Farm Safety Program. The program focuses on ageappropriate farm safety topics including safe play areas, water & ice safety, quad & dirt bike safety, machinery safety, livestock safety, hearing safety and personal responsibility.
- Alberta Health Services Oral Health Services services this school year which includes screening for dental decay, fluoride varnish and dental sealants.
- WIT will be on January 17th. The focus on the lesson will be introducing some indigenous language and a connection to the seasons. Students will us Mackenzie Brown's art work and as inspiration during the lesson.

### Work Experience Student

• We are continuing our connection with Penhold Crossing Secondary school and having students complete Work Experience programs here at Jessie Duncan. We will have a new work experience student working in grade one for the next few months.
